Ingredients

- 1 whole chicken (about 4 lb.)
- 3 large carrots, peeled & cut into chunks
- 2 parsnips, peeled & cut into chunks
- 3 medium potatoes, peeled & cut into chunks
- 1 large onion, quartered
- 3 Tbsp. olive oil
- 2 tsp. dried rosemary or fresh sprigs
- 1 tsp. dried thyme
- Salt & pepper to taste
- · 3 cloves garlic, smashed
- Optional: fresh parsley for garnish

Directions

- 1. Preheat oven to 400°F
- 2. Toss carrots, parsnips, potatoes, and onion with 2 Tbsp. olive oil, half the herbs, salt, and pepper. Spread evenly in a roasting pan.
- 3. Rub chicken with remaining olive oil, herbs, salt, and pepper. Place on top of vegetables.
- 4. Scatter garlic cloves around chicken.
- 5. Roast for 1-1.5 hours, or until chicken reaches an internal temperature of 165°F and vegetables are tender.
- 6. Let chicken rest 10 minutes before carving. Garnish with fresh parsley, if desired.

Photos supporting data are optional. Applications will be evaluated by an impartial panel of judges. Awards will be announced mid-December.
